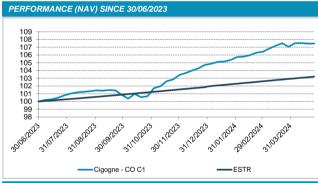
INVESTMENT OBJECTIVES

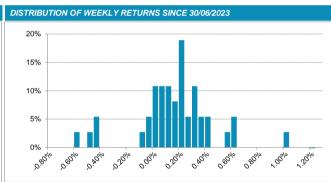
The objective of the Cigogne UCITS - Credit Opportunities fund is to generate an absolute return by exploiting a multi-strategy approach focused on the Credit theme, while maintaining a low correlation with main market trends. The sub-fund implements strategies on different types of debt securities and other debt instruments issued by public and/or private issuers worldwide. These strategies can be broken down into four main areas: relative value strategies designed to profit from price anomalies amongst debt securities and/or financial derivatives; convertible bond arbitrage strategies seeking to take advantage of market anomalies that may occur between the various components of a convertible bond; credit strategies designed to profit from excess credit returns or price anomalies in the spread on debt securities and credit derivatives; global macro strategies implemented for hedging purposes or in order to take advantage of opportunities that may arise depending on market configurations.

INVESTMENT MANAGERS' COMMENTARY

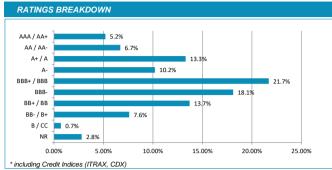
Throughout April, the economic environment remained plagued by uncertainties surrounding the direction of monetary policies at the main central banks and by tensions in the Middle East. Activity continued to head in the right direction in the eurozone, with a composite PMI once again surprising by reaching 50.3 compared with the forecast of 49.9. Inflation continued to fall, as evidenced by the CPI core rate dropping from 3.1% in February to 2.9% in March. As a result, the ECB kept its key interest rates unchanged, in line with its stance since the beginning of the year. In the United States, economic data revealed persistent inflation in March, with the CPI core rate over the previous year remaining at 3.8% compared with the forecast of 3.7%. The jobs market continued to tighten, with unemployment at 3.8% in March compared with 3.9% in February. In light of this, the Federal Reserve adopted a less accommodative tone and revised its economic activity and inflation forecasts upwards. The market now expects only two 0.25-point key rate cuts in 2024, with the first of these not taking place before September. Against this backdrop, there has been less appetite for risky assets on the financial markets. The S&P 500 fell by 4.16% over the period, while the EURO STOXX 50 dropped by 3.19%. On the credit side, the European generic 5year credit indices widened by 1.5 bps for Investment Grade names and by 20.5 bps for High Yield names. Following the less accommodative tone adopted by the Fed, there was an increase in rates, with the German 10-year yield up by 29 bps and the US 10-year yield by 48 bps. The Credit Opportunities fund delivered improved performance in April. Many companies announced their 2024 first-quarter results during the month. Healthy results from the French real estate company Altarea and the bank Unicredit were beneficial for the positions we hold in the Altarea 1.75% 01/30 and Unicredit Tier 2 7.296% papers with credit spreads that have narrowed. Hybrid bond arbitrage also did well, driven by the upturn in certain assets. Evonik Industries has announced better-than-expected profit targets for 2024 and Dürr is also very bullish about the period due in part to the sale of Danish air-conditioning system specialist subsidiary Agramkow Fluid Systems, as it aims to refocus on its core business as an automotive manufacturer and supplier. The basis arbitrage strategies, buying the bond against buying the protection on the issuer, showed resilience and delivered a good monthly performance, notably Nissan Motor 4.345% 09/27 and Sodexo 1.634% 04/26 against CDS. Lastly, we took profit at opportune prices on PSA Banque 3.875% 01/26 and Deutsche Bank FRN 07/25 after spreads narrowed on the papers. Several basis arbitrage strategies were added to the portfolio, such as Rolls Royce 5.75% 10/27 versus CDS 12/27, Crédit Agricole 5.589% 07/26 versus CDS 09/26 and the holding company of Auchan, now known as Elo 5.875% 04/28 versus CDS 06/28, all at attractive prices given current market conditions.

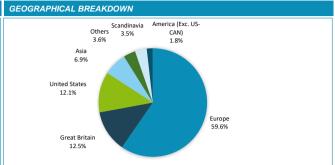

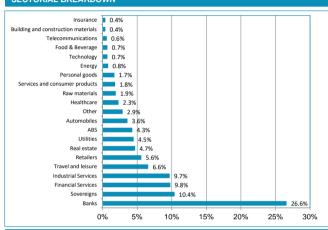
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SECTORIAL BREAKDOWN
